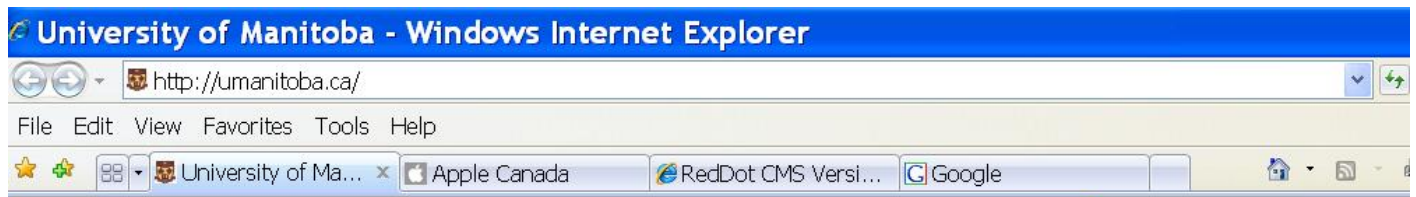


This newsletter aims to help you find better and more effective ways of using technology.

This issue's topic: **Tabbed Browsing.**

Tabbed browsing lets you load Web pages in separate tabs of a single browser window, so you can jump between them quickly and easily. The concept of "tab" comes from the physical tabs on manila folders used to store paper documents. This feature is available in Internet Explorer 7, Firefox, Safari and others.

Some common Keyboard Keystrokes for Tabbed Browsing:

| To do this | Press this |
|---|--|
| Open links in a new tab in the background | CTRL+click |
| Open links in a new tab in the foreground | CTRL+SHIFT+click |
| Open a new tab in the foreground | CTRL+T or double-click an empty space on the tab row |
| Switch between tabs | CTRL+SHIFT+TAB |
| Close current tab (or current window when there are no open tabs) | CTRL+W or ALT+F4 |
| Open a new tab in the foreground from the Address bar | ALT+ENTER |
| Switch to the last tab | CTRL+9 |
